

When a loved one passes, grieving family members and friends often are confronted with dozens of decisions about the final preparations – all of which must be made quickly and often under great emotional duress.

Pinn Memorial is here to help you.

For members in good standing*, you can expect the following:

- A personal call from Dr. Chatman or the ministerial staff
- A visit from a Deacon or Deaconess
- · Contact from the Trustees
- Personal contact and follow-up a month after the services from the Good Grief Committee to determine the need for additional counseling and/ or support.

Funerals rank among the most expensive purchase many families will ever make.

Funeral Costs

Here are some items to keep in mind:

- 1. Ask for a price list. The law requires funeral homes to give you written price lists for products and services.
- 2. Resist pressure to buy goods and services you don't really want or need.
- 3. Recognize your rights. Laws regarding funerals and burials vary from state to state. It is a smart move to ask which goods or services the law requires you to purchase and which are optional.
- 4. Apply the same smart shopping techniques you use for other major purchases.

You can cut costs by:

- · Limiting the viewing to one day or one hour before
- By dressing your loved in a favorite outfit instead of costly burial clothing.
- · One floral spray from the family
- One family car
- 5. Avoid emotional overspending
- 6. If you have not selected a funeral home, we suggest you shop around and compare prices from at least two funeral homes.



During the Deacons' and/or Trustees visits you will be provided with a list of services available to you.

These services include:

- · Prayers, condolences, comfort and support
- Consultation and design of/on the order of the service to include, minister, musical arrangements, ushers, scripture readings
- A repast at the church for up to 60 persons, if there are more than 60 guests the cost is an additional \$10 per person
- Menu selections are reviewed and number of guests confirmed by Trustee Chair
- If the church is not used for the repast, the family may receive up to \$200 for a repast outside of the church or used to defray other associated funeral expenses.
- Acknowledgements and condolences by the church clerk
- 75 half folded funeral programs, nominal fee for additional programs above 75.
